GPS MyCity


Self-guided walking tours for exploring cities on foot. Each walk includes a map as well as photos and background information.

Public Art PDX


Interactive map with photos that shows over 400 works of art in Portlan's central city.















Film Screenings

What are these modular spaces, and what impact do they have on our city? Designed to be portable,




